

### How to Clean Indulge

#### PVC Free Polyurethane with Silverguard®

---

#### Recommended Care and Cleaning Guide:

##### Remove most stains with one of the following steps:

**STEP 1:** For light soiling, a solution of 10% household liquid dish soap in warm water, applied with a soft damp cloth. Rub gently and rinse with a water dampened cloth.

**STEP 2:** For more difficult stains, dampen a soft white cloth with a solution of household bleach (10% bleach and 90% water). Rub gently and rinse with a water dampened cloth to remove bleach concentration.

##### For Disinfection:

Dampen a soft white cloth with a solution of household bleach (20% bleach and 80% water). Rub gently and rinse with a water dampened cloth to remove bleach concentration.

##### Any of the following solutions may be used as a cleaning agent:

- Alcohol, Water, and Bleach (5:5:2)
- Bleach and Water (1:5)
- Alcohol and Water (1:1)

**NOTE:** Most disinfectants will not damage Polyurethanes. All cleaners should be tested on a small, unobtrusive, area initially to confirm no immediate effect on color or product.

**CAUTION:** Certain clothing and accessory dyes (such as those used on denim jeans) may migrate to lighter colors. This phenomenon is increased by humidity and temperature and is irreversible. Please check compatibility when using this product in combination with painted or varnished surfaces.
